

# Master Gardener Seed Swap

- Do you have packets of seeds sitting around that you more than likely aren't going to use?
- Did you try a specific variety that you aren't fond of, but maybe someone could be?
- Do you collect heirloom seeds?
- Do you have flower seeds you really want to share?
- Do you have bulbs you really want to share?
- Do you have vegetable seeds you really want to share?
- Do you just plain old want to get rid of some seeds in your "collection"?
- Do you have half a pack of seeds leftover you think someone else may want to try?
- Are you willing to totally part with some seeds?
- Do you want to acquire some new seeds for this year's garden?
- Do you want to bring a friend who may be interested in swapping or acquiring seeds?

If you answered yes to any of these questions you need to come to the Seed Swap!

## Here's how it will work:

- Come Tuesday March 11<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 pm to the Summit County Extension office.
- Bring your seeds in this matter to make sorting easy when you arrive:
  - Sorted in either envelopes, the original packet, or baggies (no loose seeds or bulbs please)
  - At least 5 seeds per packet, (bulbs and special seeds may be different)
  - As much information on the packet about the seed as possible (name, heirloom, disease resistant, F1, self-saved, good producer etc., people love specifics)
- Bring a container or bag to put your acquired seeds in; also extra baggies may be helpful.
- Come knowing you may not get as much as you brought, or you may get way more than you brought!
- Tables will be set out and labeled for you to sort your seeds once you arrive.
- We will arrive and sort at 7:00 and hopefully start to "swap" at 7:30.
