Ohio Turnpike to exit 218; travel east on I-80 to Youngstown; follow I-680 to Belle Vista Ave. (exit 3B); travel south to Mahoning Ave.; turn left and continue to McKinley Ave.; turn right and follow to Gardens.

From Pittsburgh

Ohio Turnpike to exit 234; I-680 north to Youngstown; exit Glenwood/Mahoning Ave.; at stop sign turn right onto Edwards St; at traffic light turn left onto Mahoning Ave.; travel I/2 mile to McKinley Ave.; turn left and follow to Gardens.

Presently he gardens and botanizes from his home on Lickinghole Creek in Crozet, Virginia and travels extensively to promote his latest work, 'A Rich Spot of Earth': Thomas Jefferson's Revolutionary Garden at Monticello.

Marta McDowell lives, gardens and writes in Chatham, New Jersey. She is the author Beatrix Potter's Gardening Life and Emily Dickinson's Gardens.

Marta received a Historic Preservation Award from the Garden Club of America in 2014 for her work on historic gardens in New Jersey. Her husband, Kirke Bent, summarizes her biography as "I am therefore I dig."
