Flood tolerance of species

<u>Very flood tolerant</u> - able to survive deep, prolonged flooding for more than one year.

<u>Flood tolerant</u> - able to survive deep flooding for one growing season, with significant mortality occurring if flooding is repeated the following year.

<u>Intermediately flood tolerant</u> - able to survive flooding or saturated soils for 30 consecutive days during the growing season.

<u>Flood intolerant</u> – unable to survive more than a few days of flooding during the growing season without significant mortality.
